

# R. Andrews Rites Held At Melbourne

MELBOURNE — Services for Robert (Pete) Andrews, Jr., 50, rural Melbourne, were held at 1:30 p.m. Saturday from the Melbourne United Methodist Church, with the Rev. Nancy Nichols, pastor, in charge.
