Life Sketch

Wyatt Burwell Angelo, son of John B. and Ada Kimberley Angelo, was born in a log cabin on the home farm in northwest Jasper county near Collins on November 5, 1876, and died April 29, 1957. He was of a pioneer family, going to a rural school nearby and later graduating from Maxwell High school and from Drake Law school, Des Moines. He was a member of the bars of Iowa, Illinois and Wisconsin, and at the time of his death was vice president and council for the Southern Mineral corporation.

During World War I, he served on the National War Labor Board.

Mr Angelo is survived by his widow, Sada Angelo; his son John B. Angelo, and four grandchildren of Hinsdale, Illinois.
