New Year Serves Board of Supervisors A Hearty Agenda

The Marshall County Board of Supervisors stepped up to the table on January 2nd and received a full plate - complete with a couple of chairs, appointments, permits, and one for the road.

The first Board meeting of the new year began by maintaining the current Chairman and Vice-Chairman seats of Gordie Johnson and Patrick Brooks through 2008. Johnson, a Republican, has held the seat of Chairman since 1999; Brooks, a Democrat, replaced Vice-Chairman John E. Soorholtz upon his 2007 retirement.

In keeping with the yearly agenda, Johnson, Brooks, and Supervisor Ronald D. Goecke were each appointed to the fol-

lowing one-year-term committees:

Johnson - Emergency Management Agency, Marshall County Landfill Commission, MEDIC (Marshalltown Economic Development Impact Committee), and SATUCI (Substance Abuse Treatment Unit of Central Iowa).

Brooks - Area Agency on Aging, Central Iowa Juvenile Detention Commission (Eldora), District Administrative Board of Correctional Services, Mid-Iowa Community Action, Region VI Planning Commission, and the Regional Workforce Investment Board.

Goecke - Ames Service Area Advisory Board, North Iowa Juvenile Detention Commission (Waterloo),

Marshalltown Cluster Decategorization Child Welfare Service Plan, Center Associates Board of Directors, Prairie Rivers Resource Conservation & Development, and the Coalition for Youth.

The new year also brought a subsequent number of utility and development permits to the table for approval - 69 were on that plate, to be precise.

Alliant Energy offered 25 sanctioned permits, ranging from utility and electric line installation to natural gas line improvements. Areas affected by these upcoming modifications include Bangor, Iowa, Jefferson, Liscomb, Logan, Marietta, Marion, Minerva, Taylor, Timber Creek, Vienna, and Washington Townships.

Interstate Power and Light Co. (an Alliant Energy company) received five additional approvals for similar work in and around Jefferson, Marietta, and Washington. Grundy County REC was permitted to install aerial electric lines in outlying areas, as well

as Consumers Energy, which requested ten for underground/overhead utility line construction in Bangor, Eden, Jefferson, Logan, Marion, Minerva, State Center, and Washington.

Not to be left out of the double-digit fold, Qwest Communications applied for its share of 13 approvals to install underground communication lines, as well as Iowa Telecommunications, Minerva Valley Telecommunications, and Partner Communications Cooperative for similar projects. In addition, Central Iowa Water Association's eight permits for buried water line installation were also approved for construction in Green Castle, LeGrand, Logan, Minerva, State Center, Timber Creek, and Washington.

The Board of Supervisors then gave County Engineer Royce J. Fichtner the authority (in the ongoing effort for highway safety) to temporarily close any section of highway he deems hazard until repairs

can be performed accordingly. This could possibly affect portions of: Gerhart, Fairman, and Marsh Avenues, Highland Acres Road, 170th St., 230th St., 233rd St., 340th St., and a section of E-41.

To finish up, Fichtner, along with Steve Thomassen, Mark Hentges, and Dee Koch of the Secondary Road Department, were given the go ahead to issue and/or sign special permits for oversized vehicles that travel upon Marshall County's secondary roads. On some of those roads, weight limit restrictions, weight limit signs, and ONE LANE ROAD signs will be subject to change, specifically for some bridges located on the Federal Aid, Farm to Market, and Local Secondary Road Systems. Therefore, drivers who frequent these areas may want to pay a little more attention in the upcoming months for such changes.

The meeting adjourned and next time, the B.O.S. may opt for the salad.
