Levi Brown was born in Oswego county, N. Y. Sept. 17, 1823. At the age of seven years he moved to Union county, Ohio. In 1844 he moved to Fulton county, Ill, where he was married to Louisa Fancher. Dec. 4.

1852. By this union ten children were born, five boys and five girls, four of whom survive, viz: Mrs. Lucy O'Con-

nor, Mrs. Laura Downing, D. W. Brown, and S. C. Brown, all of whom were present at the death bed and funeral.

Deceased came to Iowa in 1865, to the same farm in which he died. There he maided without intermission for thirty years. His death occurred Sept. 6, 1902, his age being but eleven

days less than 79 years.
