

Ralph Buck Of Rhodes Dies Sunday

RHODES — Ralph Guy Buck, 65, Rhodes, died at his home Sunday noon of a heart attack.

Services are set for 2 p.m. Tuesday at the Rhodes Methodist Church, with the Rev. Donald Artman officiating. Burial will be in Eden Cemetery at Rhodes. Boyd-Nickell Funeral Home, Baxter, is in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Buck was born June 12, 1903, at Rhodes a son of Martin K. and Amber Buck. He graduated at Rhodes High School in 1921. He was married to Amelia Bentley June 19, 1926, at Rhodes. They lived on a farm north of Rhodes until 1951, when they retired from farming and moved to town.

He was a member of the Marshall County Board of Supervisors from 1955 to 1966. He was employed with the state as a county home consultant with social services since January, 1966. He was treasurer of Rhodes. Also, he was a director of the Iowa Good Roads Associa-
