

Paul Campbell

DIED May 18, 1983

Services were Friday for Paul Campbell, 70, State Center, who died Wednesday, May 18, at his home. The Rev. Richard Fitch was in charge with burial following in Eden Cemetery in Rhodes.

There were also services by the Banner Lodge 12, IOOF.

Bearers were Bob Mosebach, Ed Harsha, Gene Gibbs, Kenny Hollingsworth, Charles Thomas and Howard Starn.

Groups attending were the Rebekah Lodge and both state and local IOOF representatives and the Melbourne and State Center Lions Clubs.

Mr. Campbell was born January 17, 1913, in

Summersville, MO, a son of Herman and Olivia Fredrick Campbell. He was reared and educated in Bagley, and later lived with his family in Knoxville, State Center and Rhodes. He moved to Melbourne in 1958, and to State Center in 1973.

He was a sales representative for the Ad-Craft line of advertising supplies. He was a member of the State Center United Methodist Church, a charter member of the Melbourne Lions Club, director and treasurer of the Southview Acres Senior Citizens Housing project, member of Banner Lodge 123, IOOF, and of Patriarchs Militant, IOOF, Cedar Falls. He

was also a member of the Krockers Encampment and a grand high priest of the Iowa Grand Encampment of IOOF.

Mr. Campbell was also a charter member and historian of the Iowa Numismatic Association.

Mr. Campbell's only survivor is a sister, Norma Campbell of State Center.
