PERRY L. CARVER CALLED BY DEATH

Funeral services for the late Perry L. Carver, formerly of Collins, were held Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the Collins Church of Christ, in charge of Rev. John Adamson, pastor of the M. E. church.

Mr. Carver passed away at the home of his sister, Mrs. O. B. Patterson, at Battle Lake, Minn., Wednesday, March 30, the body being brought here to the home of his niece, Mrs. J. O. Shearer, preceding burial.

Deceased was a brother of Chas. Carver and Mrs. C. R. Wick of Collins.

Pall bearers were nephews, being Harry Carver, Wm. Carver, Lee Morrison, Oliver Shearer, Jesse Torry and Leonard Clements. Interment was in Collins Evergreen cemetery, at the side of his parents.

Obituary

Perry L. Carver, youngest child of Archibald and Hannah Carver, was born at Orfordville, Wisconsin, April 1, 1873, and passed away at the home of his sister, Mrs. O. B. Patterson, at Battle Lake, Minn., March 30, 1932, at the age of 58 years, 11 months and 29 days.

When but a boy he moved with his parents to Iowa and grew to manhood near Collins, where he lived until after the death of his parents, then returning to Wisconsin making that his home until the past two years, which were spent with his sister in Minnesota.

He leaves to mourn his passing three sisters, Mrs. Maggie Halfhead of Broadhead, Wis.; Mrs. Hattie Wick of Collins, Mrs. Etta Patterson of Battle Lake, Minn., his only brother, Charles Carver, of Collins; a number of nieces and nephews, besides many other relatives and friends.
