Ray Casey, former resident, succumbs at Arcadia, Calif. July 11, 1963 State Center Enterprise

Word has been received here of the death of Ray W. Casey, a former resident and owner of the Casey & Sons Lumber Company in State Center, on June 30 at Arcadia, California. Born at Paton, Iowa, Mr. Casey had lived at State Center and Monrovia, Calif., before moving to Arcadia twenty years ago.

Funeral services were held last Wednesday morning in the chapel of the Glasser and Miller Mortuary with the Rev. E. H. Kreidt in chare. Private entombment followed at Mountain View Mauso-

leum.

Surviving are his widow, Freida D. Casey and two daughters, Deloris Mazy of Arcadia and Luella Wilkes of Lompoe. He also leaves six grandchildren, one great grandchild and a brother, Everett Casey of Boone, Iowa.
