Dorothy was born on January 11, 1913 in Wilson, Kansas, the daughter of Anton F. and Sophia Soucek Somer. Following graduation form Wilson High School in 1932, she worked for her father in the Somer Hardware business. She married Paul Charvat (also of Wilson) on September 9, 1944 in Nashville, Tennessee moving later in 1944 to Cincinnati, Ohio. In 1961, they moved to Wichita, Kansas and lived there for 30 years until 1991 when they moved to Marshalltown, Iowa. Her husband preceeded her in death there in 1992. She is survived by Daughter, Sandra Burke (Dr. James), Ames, IA, Grandsons: Paul of New York City and Christopher of Columbus, Ohio; Sister, Sophia (Ray) Wallert, Kansas City, Missouri; several sisters-and brothers-in law: and amny nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her husband Paul; her parents; four sisters, Alice Park, Georgia Dennis, Christine Wallert, Marie Janousek and one brother, Edward Somer. Dorothy is dearly missed and a memorial will be established in Dorothy's name in Wilson, Kansas, the Czech community where both the Somer and Charvat families originally settled after immigrating from the Bohemia and Moravia.
