## Funeral Services Held at Colo for Isaac Coughenour

Colo, Ia., Nov. 24-Funeral services were held here at 2:00 Monday afternoon for Isaac Coughenour at the Calvary Evangelical church in Colo, with Rev. Keith Orr in charge. He was united in marriage to Agnes Bowers, daughter of Christian and Hattie Bowers of Salisbury, Penn., on January 2, 1907.
