STRUCK BY TRAIN; MAN WAS KILLED

FATALITY AT RHODES MONDAY
EVENING. — NEAL CROM-
LEY THE VICTIM.

Collins, Sept. 28—Neal Cromley, 65, retired farmer of Rhodes, the first station on the Milwaukee east of here, was instantly killed at 6:15 Monday evening, when he was struck by a west-bound passenger train a mile and a half east of there.

Cromley was walking the track returning home from the farm of his brother, the late Harry Cromley.

Cromley stepped out of the way of an east-bound freight train and evidently did not see the west-bound passenger, which it was said, was running slowly, but could not be stopped. Cromley was hurled from the track. The body was brought to Rhodes.

Cromley had lived in and near Rhodes since a small boy. For many years he was engaged in farming with his brother Harry, who died last spring. In later years he had lived in Rhodes and for a time was janitor of the school building and was employed by the C. M. & St. P. railroad.

His widow and one son, Roy, of Des Moines, survive him. A brother is living in Ohio and a sister resides in Pennsylvania
