We reprint the following from the Maxwell Tribune, Dr. Davis having been a former resident here:

Dr. D. J. Davis, a former resident of Maxwell, died at his home in Lowell, Mich., Nov. 9. Dr. Davis practiced as a veterinarian during his three-year residence here, leaving about nine years ago for Michigan. Both Dr. and Mrs. Davis were members of the Christian church and active in the work of the church.

The following obituary appeared in the Lowell (Mich.) Ledger of Nov. 20.

Dr. John Davis was born Nov. 28, 1880, in Jamaica, British West Indies. He passed away at his home in Lowell, Nov. 9, 1930, at the age of 49 years, 11 months and 12 days.

He came to this country in August, 1909, and spent three years at the Grand Rapids Veterinary college, graduating in 1912.

"On June 6, 1912, he was united in marriage with Miss Hattie Hall of Grand Rapids. He practiced veterinary medicine seven years in Collins, and three years in Maxwell, Ia., and acted as assistant state veterinarian during the last five years of his practice. Owing to ill health he was forced to give up his profession. For the past nine years he has resided in Lowell.

Surviving are his widow and an adopted daughter, Mrs. E. G. Greenfield, of Marshall, Mich., and one granddaughter, Lou Ann Greenfield, also three brothers, Hugh, of Jamaica; Richard, of Central America, and Arnold, of Brooklyn, N. Y., and one sister, Mrs. Tribble, of Colorado, and a host of friends.

"His funeral was held at his home in Lowell, Nov. 12, and interment was in Oakhill cemetery, Grand Rapids."
