Susie Winebrenner-Davis, 78

Susie Emma Winebrenner-Davis, 78, died of congestive heart failure on Thursday, Aug. 1, 2002 in Tacoma, WA. Her body was cremated and she along with her husband's ashes were scattered at a later date in the state of Washington.

Mrs. Davis was born in Coon Rapids, Carroll County, Iowa, on Sept. 28, 1927, fifth of nine children to Samuel Henry (S.H.) Winebrenner and Lovina Odessa (Dessie) Luckinbill.

She married Douglas Charles Davis on Sept. 20, 1942. They lived in Pleasant Hill for a while before they moved to a dairy farm near Van Meter where they adopted a baby girl and named her Sue Louise Davis. They retired from the farm in 1968 and moved to Woodward where Susie worked at the Woodward State Hospital for a while and was a member of St. Malachy Parish.

McCallsburg where she was a homemaker. She was a member of St. Gabriel's Parish. After her husband, Doug, died May 4, 2000, Susie moved to Washington State in August of 2000 to be near her family. She did some traveling to Hawaii and down the West Coast.

She is survived by her daughter, Susie, now of Olympia, WA, two brothers Oscar Eugene (Gene) (wife Shari) of Shelton, WA, and Leonard (Curly) (wife Nancy) of Vashon Island, and four sister's-in-law: Clara Winebrenner of Palm City, FL; Tiny Winebrenner of Tacoma, WA, Priscilla (Perky) Winebrenner and Marge Davis both of Des Moines and many nieces and nephews.

Her parents, her husband Doug, and five brothers preceded her in death; Ralph (Rex), Albert (Al), Samuel (Cliff), William (Bill) and John and a sister Stella Winebrenner-Kepple.
