## Rosa S. Day, 57 Collins, Dies

COLLINS—Rosa Stella Day, 76, died at McVay Nursing Home here Tuesday night.

She was born at Peoria, Iowa. She was preceded in death by her husband four months ago, her parents and a brother and two sisters.

Survivors are two nephews and a niece.

Funeral will be Friday at 2:45 p.m. at the Christian Church here with the Rev. Ellis Morton in charge. Burial will be in Evergreen Cemetery here.

The body will be at Brouhard Funeral Home, Zearing, until being taken to the church Friday.

Miss Day was a member of Rebekah Lodge which will have charge of graveside services.

Funeral services for Rosa Day were held at the Collins Christian church Friday afternoon April 19, with the pastor, Rev. Ellis Martin, officiating, who spoke from a text selected by the deceased. Accompanied by Mrs Fred Mead at the piano Mrs Kenneth Tomlinson and Mrs Donald Carlson sang The Beautiful Garden of Prayer, and God's Tomorrow.
