FUNERAL SERVICES OF DORA FISH

Mrs Fish suffered a hip fracture in a fall Tuesday, Nov. 27 in the home of her aunt, Mrs Emma Ozmun, whom she was visiting in Collins. On Wednesday she was removed to University hospital, where she died Friday as a result of complications from the fall.

On Dec. 24, 1899, she was married to Ora Francis Fish, who preceded her in death on May 13, 1945. To this union three children were born: Howard of Finley, Cal.; Harold of Marshalltown, and Dale, who died April 13, 1930.

For the past few years Mrs Fish had been a member of Western Old People's home of the E. U. B. church in Cedar Falls. She had been a long-time member of the Evangelical United Brethren church and a charter mem-
