Collins Woman Dies Sunday; Services to Be Held Friday PM

Her death occurred on July 4, 1960 in the Evangelical hospital in Marshalltown at the age of 57 years and 22 days. She had been in failing health for several months.

On February 5, 1921 she was united in marriage with Myrl M. Brown and to this union were born two children: Dale Everett who died in infancy and Doris, Mrs. Wesley Borts of Collins.
