Elizabeth Dolph, eldest daughter of Elmore and Achsah Dolph was born on a farm northwest of Collins Aug. 2, 1874. In her early girlhood she gave her heart to God and her young life to His service.

From her childhood she was always a great favorite possessing a loving disposition, and did much to smooth the rough pathway of others.

She lived at home with her parents and from the time of the death of her mother she took over the responsibility of keeping up the home and caring for her father, brothers and sisters, some of whom were quite small, never leaving them until they were old enough to care for themselves. Surely the Saviour will say:

"Inasmuch as you did it unto the least of these, you did it unto me."

She bore her sufferings with patience and kept her troubles to herself as much as possible that she might make the burden lighter for those around her. Those who knew her bore this testimony: "There is nothing too good to say of her."

On August 28, 1916, she was married to George Newton Foote of Ames. Since that time she has resided in Ames. Her husband preceded her to the better world in August, 1925.

Her death on March 10, 1933, came as a sad shock to her relatives and friends, as she had been apparently in good health up until the day before her death, which was pronounced due to heart failure. She was 58 years, 7 months and 8 days of age.)

Her father, mother, one sister and one brother preceded her in death. She leaves to mourn her passing four sisters and five brothers and their families. Her brothers and sisters are George, Earl and Edgar Dolph, and Mrs. Bessie Granger of this vicinity; Adelbert of Rockwell City, Ia.; Mrs. Mable Trumm of Grand River, Ia.; Frank Dolph of Churdan, Ia.; Mrs. Clara Trowbridge of Turlock, Calif., and Mrs. Emma Brown of Chula Vista, Calif. All brothers and sisters were present at the funeral except Mrs. Emma Brown.

The funeral was held Sunday afternoon, March 12, at the Church of Christ in Collins, in charge of the Rev. Foster of Ames. She was laid to rest in the Collins Evergreen cemetery.

Music was furnished by a quartet composed of the Misses Mary Holmes and Zola Gilley and Messrs. J. C. Gingles and Thos. Huntrod, accompanied at the piano by Miss Jessie Huntrod.

The pall bearers were J. E. Hale, J. R. Witmer, Chas. Waltz, Lewis Waltz, Chas. Fleming and E. G. Schoonover. Miss Cora Wilkinson and Mrs. Vera Morgan of Ames had charge of the flowers.
