Rita M. Howe, 83, of rural Clemons, died Saturday evening, Jan. 24, at Israel Family Hospice House in Ames.

She was born May 2, 1920, in rural Clemons to Arthur and Nellie (Lawler) Dunn. She graduated from Liberty Consolidated High School in Liberty Township, rural Saint Anthony. She attended Iowa State Teachers' College in Cedar Falls, and taught in Clarksville and Eldora. On June 1, 1944, she married Ralph R. Howe at Sacred Heart Church in Saint Anthony. They lived in Miami and Key West, Fla., a short while before Ralph was sent overseas for a tour of duty with the Navy. In 1948 the couple moved from Eldora to north of Clemons, where they began farming near her parents. She was an active, longtime member of Sacred Heart Church, where she served on the cluster council, was president of the parish council and held various offices of the Altar and Rosary Society and Dubuque Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women, including president for both organizations. She served on the Marshall County election board for many years, acting as a counter, and hosting caucus groups in her home.

Survivors include her husband, Ralph; six children, Sister Connie Howe of Eldora, Rick (and Patricia) Howe of State Center; Carmen Bolton of Melbourne, Russell Howe of Detroit, Mich., Tamma Howe of Des Moines and Roger Howe of rural Clemons; four grandchildren; and one sister, Opal Grandfield of Des Moines.

She was preceded in death by her parents, a brother, Leo Dunn and a sister, Jerene Barlow.

Funeral mass was held Wednesday at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Saint Anthony with the Rev. Jon Seda officiating. Burial was in St. John's Cemetery, rural Saint Anthony.
