

Crash Kills Rhodes Couple; Others From Area Injured

Harry Eddy, 38, and his wife, Evelyn, 36, of Rhodes were among four persons killed in Iowa highway accidents Tuesday.

Mr. and Mrs. Eddy were killed in a two-car smashup near Ames that injured six other people.

EDDY WAS driving a car in which six persons were riding including Mrs. Donna Smith, 36, of Rhodes, and her children, David, 3, and Sally Ann, 5, as well as Bonnie, the infant daughter of the Eddys.

In the second car were Walter Kent Fox, 19, of Waterloo, and Elsie Flemmer, 20, of Nevada.

Accident investigators said the crash occurred when the Fox car was passing another vehicle.

ALL OF the injured were taken to the Mary Greeley Hospital in Ames.

Services for Harry Glenn and Evelyn Roberta Eddy will be Friday at 1:30 p. m. from the Methodist Church in Rhodes. Burial will be in the

Eden Cemetery at Rhodes. Boyd-Nickell Funeral Home of Baxter is in charge of arrangements.

The other deaths were Herman P. Clausen, 71, of Alta, and Joseph Pitzten, 20, of Newell, victims of a two-car collision near Storm Lake.

He served in the Navy during World War II in the Pacific theater from 1945 until 1947. He was married on April 17, 1947, to Evelyn Roberta Gray.

They lived in Marshalltown until 1948 when they moved to Rhodes. He was a welder at Lennox Industries Inc., in Marshalltown.

Besides his children, he is survived by his parents; two brothers, Leonard of Omaha and Allan of Rhodes; three sisters, Mrs. William (Patricia) Hart of Boone, Mrs. Lonnie (Mavis) Brown of Marshalltown and Miss Leola Eddy of Iowa Falls.

EVERLYN EDDY was born March 17, 1929, in Marshalltown; a daughter of James and Gladys Gray. She attended Rhodes School and was graduated in 1946.
