## Christopher Evans Funeral

Christopher C. Evans was born near Springfield, Ill., in the year 1858 and at the age of 8 years he, with his parents, moved to Iowa, near Collins, and in this vicinity he has lived the rest of his life. He was married to Miss Jennie Ozmun Nov. 25, 1882, and died Nov. 12, 1911. He leaves to mourn their loss, a loving devoted wife and two sons, Eddy Clinton and Christopher Verne, whose loving sympathy will help sustain their mother in this her greatest trial.

The above obituary was read by the preacher, Rev. S. F. Spainhower, pastor of the Christian Church, at the funeral service which was held at the home Tuesday 11 a. m. The

audience filled the residence and many were outside. The pastor's discourse gave strong and convincing proof of the immortality of the soul and the eternal life. It was well calculated to give hope and consolation to the bereaved ones. A fine choir consisting of Mrs. Glenn McCord and Miss Maud Wells, sopranos; Miss Erma Anderson, contralto; Glen McCord, tenor; and Dr. R. C. Robertson, bass; with Miss Julia Anderson accompanist on the piano, rendered tender and beautiful sacred songs. The floral tributes were very beautiful.

The interment was at the Evergreen Cemetery. The pall bearers were George Vasey, Geo McQuiston, L. D. Shearer, C. R. Wick, Geo. Elliott and Thos. Elliott.

Deceased leaves one brother, W. S. Evans at Marino, Colo., and two sisters, Mrs. Chas. Sapp, Galt, Mo., and Mrs R. B. Dawson, Newton, Iowa.

Mr. Evans was a devoted husband, a loving father, and a neighbor whose help was given as far as lay in his power when necessity arose.

The bereaved have the heartfelt sympathy of the community.
