MRS. C. E. FISH

Mrs. Ruth Fish, wife of C. E. Fish and popular Collins matron, passed away Friday at the Iowa Lutheran hospital in Des Moines.

Funeral services were held Saturday morning at 11, from the home in Collins and burial in Evergreen cemetery. The services were in charge of Rev. J. Frank Moore of Manchester, a longtime friend.

She was born September 17, 1896, the eldest daughter of the late William D. and Edna S. McIntosh, of Manchester. There she grew to womanhood and after graduating from the Manchester high school, attended Iowa State college at Ames, graduating with the class of 1918. During her attendance there she became affiliated with the Alpha Delta Pi sorority.

The year following her graduation there she taught in the school at Hazelton and on July 16, 1919, she was united in marriage to C. E. Fish of Collins and there their home had been since, with the exception of two years spent at Algona, where Mr. Fish served as assistant county agent.

She leaves besides her husband, three children, Margaret Jane, 14, Ruth Ann, 11, and Charles Lester, 4. There are also two sisters, Mrs. Gertka of Edgewood, Iowa, and Mrs. Gladys Nesmith of Kellogg. An aunt, Mrs. Juliette Pierce of San Pedro, Calif., had made her home with the niece during the past few months.
