John S. Foley, 87, died Wednesday, Oct. 23, at Harbor Crest Home in Fulton, Mass.

He was born Oct. 7, 1915, in Nevada to Thomas James and Mary Elizabeth (Wheelock) Foley. He graduated in 1935 from Kelley High School. He married Irene Mae Thomas on Nov. 8, 1945, at St. Cecelia Catholic Church in Ames. He was a veteran of the Army (drafted Feb. 6, 1941, to July 2, 1945) serving during WWII. He was a Staff Sergeant, serving with the famous "Hell on Wheels" 2nd Armored Division, a platoon Sergeant in charge of the trucks that hauled the gasoline to the front lines to refill armored tanks. He served from Fort Benning, Ga., to Berlin and was in seven battles and earned two commendations and the Bronze Star. He was a member of Prince of Peace Parish, the Veteran of Foreign Wars VFW post 9664, the National Association of Retired Veteran Railway Employees unit 67, the TCU Transportation Union and the Loyal Order of the Moose #363. He retired from the Chicago Northwestern Railroad in 1980 after 34 years of service. He later worked for the Ford Auto dealer for 11 years. He was a volunteer Cub Scout Master and past president of Clinton High Boosters Club. He was sports fan and avid Cubs and Hawkeye fan, he managed a Little League team, enjoyed traveling and camping; and his greatest love was spending time with his family and grandchildren.

Survivors include his wife, Irene of Clinton; a daughter, Ann Foley of Davenport; four sons, Bill (and Nancy) of Fulton, James (and Terry) of Orange

Park, Fla., Michael of Colo, and Daniel "Beaver" of Belle Plaine; 10 grandchildren; and a sister-in-law, Alice Foley, of Story City.

He was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters and four brothers.
