

Fowler, T. L.

Many of our readers are saddened to learn of the death of T. L. Fowler who with his wife run a boarding house known as the Fowler House in Collins. Since the death of his wife he has made his home with his son Loren E. Fowler in Baxter and later moving to Glidden where he died Saturday evening. The following is the obituary as published in the Baxter Free Era. (New Era?)

Theodore L. Fowler, son of Chancellor and Nancy Fowler, was born in Orange county, New York, September 22, 1837. His young manhood was spent in Michigan, where he learned carpentering, which trade he followed as an assistant to his father.

On November 25, 1860, he was united in marriage to Miss Lettie Jane Branden of New Orleans, La., the ceremony being performed at La-Porte, Indiana. For a number of years he and his wife made their home in Indiana. They later moved to Iowa where the remainder of their lives was spent.

The wife, who was a devout christian woman and a member of the M. E. church, passed away December 19th, 1912.

For a number of weeks Grandfather Fowler has been in feeble health, due to the weight of years having at the time of his death reached the age of 81 years, 8 months and 21 days.

He is survived by a brother George of Huntington Beach, California, by two sons, Charles, of South Bend, Indiana and Loren E. of Glidden and by six grandchildred.

Funeral services were conducted at Glidden and the remains taken to Baxter where interment was made in the Restland Monday afternoon.
