

Life Long Resident of Collins Township Victim Heart Attack

Collins, August 19—A. J. Franklin, 65, lifelong resident of this community died at his home here Wednesday of a heart attack, after a year's suffering from heart trouble.

Funeral services will be held Friday at 2 p.m. from the Collins United Brethren church, with the pastor Rev. Lawrence Lee in charge. Burial will be in the family lot in the Collins cemetery.

He was born on the Franklin homestead a mile west of Collins, June 11, 1878, youngest son of Edmun and Amanda Franklin. He was married in April, 1905 to Miss Rose Vasey and they established their home in Collins, where he engaged in the photograph business, in which he was actively engaged until the last year, when his health interfered.
