FUNERAL SERVICES FOR IRA FRANKLIN HELD SATURDAY

Funeral services for the late Ira Franklin, who died suddenly last Thursday morning, were held Saturday afternoon, April 26, at the Collins Church of Christ, the Rev. Lloyd Patton officiating.
