He was a retired fire chief with the Ankeny Fire Department and an Army veteran of World War II. He was a member of the Iowa Fireman's Association. Polk County Fire Chiefs Association, State of Iowa Fire Chiefs Association and Retired Fire Chiefs of Iowa Association. He was a past president of Ankeny Lions Club, a 55year member and past commander, adjutant, sergeant of arms, color guard and correspondent of Albaugh-McGovern American Legion Post 42. He was a member of his church's board, Parish Relations Committee and pastor search committee. He was awarded a French diploma in October for helping to liberate France during World War II and had received an Outstanding Community Service Award in

1991 from former Gov. Terry Branstad.
