## COUNTY PIONEER CALLED BY DEATH

ROBERT GAMBLE DIED AT  
HOME OF SISTER MRS.  
GORDON, LAST NIGHT

Robert N. Gamble, 71, a member of one of the pioneer families of Indian Creek township, died at midnight at the home of his sister Mrs. J. H. Golden with whom he had made his home since the death of his mother twenty-six years ago.
