Myland (Mylie) A. Gaudry of Morson, Ontario, Canada and 1916 South Center Street in Marshalltown, Iowa died November 26, 2007, at Riverside Health Care in Rainy River, Ontario. A funeral service and celebration of his life was held on Saturday, December 1, in Rainy River, Ontario.

Mylie was born on January 2, 1925, in Minihiko, Ontario. He was the youngest son of Cleophaus and Blanche Gaudry's thirteen children.

He attended high school in Kenora, Ontario and worked for his brother in the tourist business.

At that time he became involved with the "Air Cadets" just missing the call to World War II. It was then that he learned to fly, earning his pilots license at age sixteen.

He was married to Evelyn Kregor in 1947. They lived in Minihiko where he started a small minnow business. In 1958 he bought a tourist resort on Lake of the Woods and moved his family there. With their help he built up the resort and changed the name to "Mylies Place." In the early 1960's he bought a float plane which he flew into tiny lakes, where he trapped minnows to supply the camp and several others in the area.

In September of 1976 the family was shocked and saddened by the sudden death of Evelyn, his wife of 29 years.

On December 10 of 1977, Mylie was united in marriage to Roberta Palmer of Marshalltown, Iowa. The Gaudry family also welcomed a sister, Janet (Palmer) Wenk. They worked together until the resort was sold in 1982. At that time they built a cabin on a spot he had set aside years earlier. For seven more years he made tackle to sell along with the minnows and did guiding service for the camp. He loved cooking a shore lunch for fisherman and friends.

The rest of his life was divided between the lake, Iowa, and Florida. When his health failed he entered Riverside Health Care in Rainy River, Ontario. He was treated by the staff with great care and kindness and was happy to be close to his family and the lake.

Those left behind to mourn his death were his wife of thirty years, Roberta of Marshalltown; son Brad (Joni) of Minto, North Dakota; son Daryl (Ellen) of Selkirk, Manitoba, Canada; daughter Sandra Brandt of Grand Forks, North Dakota; son Duane (Marlene) of Estevan, Saskatchewan, Canada; and daughter Janet (George) Wenk of Marshalltown, Iowa.
