On August 31, 1940, She married Don R. Gawtry in Ft. Dodge. They lived in Cherokee, IA, Detroit, MI, Marysville, MI, Port Huron, MI, Pembina, ND, and from 1955-2001 in International Falls, Minnesota. Following Don's death, she moved to Marshalltown in 2001. While in International Falls, she volunteered many hours with Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, First Methodist and First Lutheran Churches, League of Women Voters, Falls Hospital Auxiliary, and Band Mothers Club. She was a

member of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church and NARFE (National Association of Retired Federal Employees. Her family came first, and other interests included reading, gardening, cooking, and baking. She was creative, artistic, and known for her organizational skills.
