William George Former Collins Resident Is Dead 1938 ____

Collins, March 18-The body of William George, 62, native son of this neighborhood, who died Ottumwa on Thursday is expected to arrive here today for the funeral service and burial.

William, son of Charles and Anna George, one of the pioneer Collins families, was born on a farm east of here August 2, 1876 He grew up in this community and was married to Cora Teed, daughter of another pioneer family, on March 3, 1900. She died in 1917. 1918

Eight children were born to this union, two daughters preceding the parents in death, one in infancy and another in later years. Those living are Mrs. John Huntrods of Collins, Mrs. Florence Thompson of Des Moines, Mrs. Richard Maxwell of Maxwell, Mrs. Will Ditler of Maxwell the son Charles George of Los Angeles.

Mr. George was married again on August 13, 1925, his second wife being Mrs. Doris Roop of Des Moines. She, with the six children and one stepdaughter, Mrs. Wesley Marchant of Bloomfield, survive him.

After leaving Collins George had lived in Des Moines, Ottumwa and other places, yet he is well and most favorably remembered here.

The body was taken to the home of his daughter Mrs. Huntrods of Collins.
