Music played an important part in her life. She played the piano and had a large collection of sheet music.

She didn't like technology and all the new gadgets. She kidded that she had just learned how the telephone worked and didn't understand or care how a fax was transmitted, or typewriters or computers worked.

Alice still drove her yellow-green 1979 Maverick with the green top, although not very far. It has just 80,000 actual miles on it. She was a valued member of all the organizations she belonged to, and attended meetings regularly.

Her work in the Iowa Citizens for Community Improvement organization, protesting large hog confinements, led to her sharing the stage at rallies with Willie Nelson in Des Moines and Rev. Jesse Jackson at her farm.

She was preceded in death by her parents, husband, one brother, one sister and an infant granddaughter.

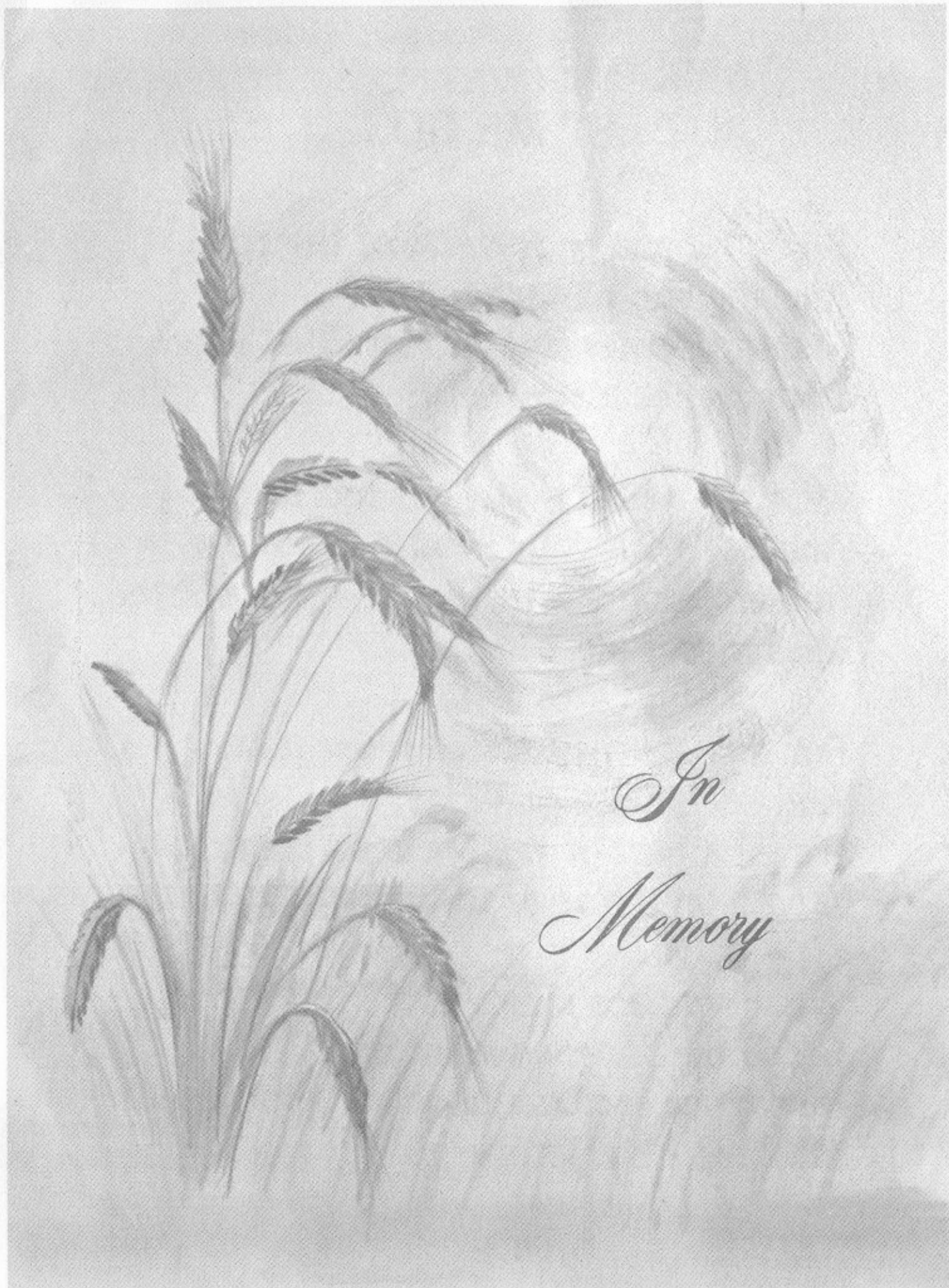
