Elevator Falls, Kills Woman At Haverhill

Mrs. Clarence Goodman was fatally injured at 9. a.m. Tuesday when a corn elevator fell on her at her farm home two miles west of Haverhill. Dr. Harold E. Sauer, coroner, ruled the death accidental.

Authorities said the Goodmans were moving the elevator from a temporary slat corn crib, which had been filled, to another crib location. Apparently Mrs. Goodman was either standing under the elevator or had walked under it when the machine collapsed.

APPARENTLY either the cable or the winch assembly falled and the elevator collapsed directly on top of Mrs. Goodman Authorities said apparently in elevator parts were broken.

Dr. Sauer reported that she died instantly of a broken neck and other multiple fractures and injuries.

Mrs. Goodman was born Iva Marie Dodd at Collins Oct. 4 1913, the daughter of John and Emma Halterman Dodd. Sinc her marriage March 2, 1932 at State Center to Mr. Goodman
