

Forrest D. Granger, 76, of Collins died of cancer at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines.

He was born in Colo to Henry and Bessie (Dolph) Granger. He lived in Story and Marshall counties his entire life. He was married on Dec. 14, 1940, to Roberta Sink at Rhodes. He was a prominent farmer in the Collins area and a long-time air pilot.
