

GREGG, FORMERLY OF RHODES, DIES

Drops Dead in Depot at Ames

HEADED RHODES SCHOOL SEVERAL YEARS AGO

**W. B. Gregg, Superintendent at
Peru, Lecturing at Ames,
When Stricken on Walk Home
Friday Night — Funeral and
Burial to Be at Rhodes.**

W. B. Gregg, superintendent of the school at Peru, Iowa, and superintendent at Rhodes five years ago, dropped dead at 8:30 o'clock Friday evening in the union depot at Ames, according to word received by relatives at Rhodes this morning.

Mr. Gregg was lecturing at Ames for several days and was staying at a boarding house to which he was returning when he was stricken. He had taken a short cut thru the depot and suddenly became ill and died before help could be summoned. Heart trouble was believed the cause of his death.

At Rhodes Five Years.

Mr. Gregg held the superintendency of the Rhodes school for five years, leaving about five years ago. His home was at Hedrick, but he visited Rhodes frequently with his daughter, Mrs. Donald Noble. Mrs. Gregg was visiting her daughter at the time the news of her husband's death was received, and Mr. Gregg had visited in Rhodes only last Tuesday.

He was born in Michigan Jan. 2, 1871, and spent many years in the teaching profession. Mrs. Gregg also taught in the Rhodes school and was still associated in teaching with her husband, being a member of the faculty at Peru.

Funeral Monday.

Funeral services will be held at 1 p. m. Monday from the Methodist Episcopal church at Rhodes in charge of Rev. W. E. Sands, of Peru, and burial will be in the Rhodes cemetery.
