Ebenezer Guy was born in Sallia county, Ohio, September 16, 1828 and died at the home of his son, W. H. Guy, in Wiley Colorado, October 2nd 1918 at the age of 90 years and 16 days.

He was married to Mary Coyler, who survives him, in Indiana December 29, 1852. To this union were born eleven children, eight of whom survive him. Wm. H. Guy of Wiley, Martha Evans of Collins Iowa, James Guy of Kansas City, Nan Paton of Paris Missouri, Sarah Teed of Collins Iowa, Electa Downing of Wiley Colorado, Frank Guy of Lamar Colorado and Minta Hall of Denver Colorado. Of three children who are dead two died in infancy and John Guy who died in his 37th year.

There are also 37 grandchildren and 50 great grandchildren who mourn his departure.

His brother James Guy died one year ago in his 98th year. The deceased was one of a family of 17 children, all of whom have preceded him to the other life.

He was one of the pioneers of this country, having come to Indiana in 1852 moving to Iowa in 1855, being one of the first settlers in Iowa. He came to Lamar, Colorado in January, 1891, becoming one of the early settlers of Prowers county.

Mr. Guy has done his part in helping to develope this county. He is gone but his good works will go on and follow him into eternity. He was a good husband, father, neighbor and citizen and will be greatly missed. Like a ripe shock of corn he has been gathered home to his people.

Funeral services were held at the home of W. H. Guy at Wiley. The grandsons of deceased acted as pall-bearers. Burial took place at Lamar. — Wiley Journal.
