RHODES MAN DIES.

Aaron Hale Succumbs Following Stroke of Apoplexy. APR 7, 1929

Aaron Hale, an old resident of Rhodes, died at 5:30 Sunday afternoon at his home in Rhodes following a stroke of apoplexy suffered last Tuesday evening.

Aaron Hale was born in England in the year 1854. He came to Canada with his parents shortly after the civil war. The family later settled in Cook county, Illinois, before coming to Rhodes.

Mr. Hale was married twice, and his first wife, Mary Sullen Hale died a few years after their marriage. He later married Mrs. Jessie Johnson, who survives him. He is also survived by two sons, Aaron and Milton; two daughters, Mildred and Florence; one adopted son, Fred, all at home; a stepson, Robert Johnson, of Flint, Mich.; and a step-daughter, Mrs. Roy Baker, of Collins. Five brothers and two sisters also survive him. The brothers are James and Roy Hale, of Fort Dodge, William, of LeMars, Tom, of Iowa Falls, and Andrew Hale, of Rhodes. The sisters are Miss Miriam Hale and Mrs. Fannie Heath, of Fort Dodge. APR 9, 1929

Aaron Hale passed away at his home in Rhodes, Iowa, Sunday evening at 5:30, April 7, 1929.

Mr. Hale was the son of James and Lucy Hale. He was born in England in the year 1854, coming with his parents to America shortly after the Civil war, locating in Port Sarnia, Canada, where he lived for about two years, then moving to Cook county, Illinois, where they lived for a number of years. He then came to Iowa and made his home on the farm until a few years ago, when he came to Rhodes where he resided until his death. He was married to Mary Sullen who preceded him in death, and was later united in marriage to Mrs. Jessie Johnson. Besides his wife he leaves to mourn his departure two sons, Milton and Aaron; two daughters, Mildred and Florence; one adopted son, Fred Hale, all of Rhodes; one stepson, Robert Johnson of Flint, Mich., and one step-daughter, Mrs. Roy Baker of Collins. Five brothers, James Hale and Roy Hale of Fort Dodge; Tom Hale of Iowa Falls; William Hale of LeMars and Andy Hale of Rhodes; two sisters, Miriam Hale and Mrs. Fannie Heath of Fort Dodge also survive.
