of the deceased.

Susan Hall Halterman, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dennis Hall, was born in Ohio, July 20, 1854, and came with her parents to Palmyra, Warren county, Iowa, when but a small child. She grew to womanhood in that community and was united in marriage to John Halterman.

After several years, the family moved to a farm near Collins. After rearing their family, they moved to Collins and it was here that Mr. Halterman passed away on Jan 8, 1923. Of the children born to this union, the two daughters preceded her in death. Surviving are the four sons, Henry of Nevada, Dennis and Melvin of Collins and John of near Roland. She is also survived by one stepdaughter, Mrs. Belle Gilley, and a number of grandchildren, great grandchildren and other more distant relatives.
