

DEATH OF MRS. L. T. HARMON

Hattie Elizabeth Thompson was born in Jasper county, Iowa, on Aug. 27, 1870, and passed away at her home at Arnolds Park, Ia., on Monday, January 27, 1930, at the age of 59 years and 5 months.

She was the daughter of Samuel B. and Catharine Thompson, with whom she lived and grew to womanhood.
