On October 14, 1933, Neoma was united in marriage to Earl T. Helland in Marshalltown. She was employed as the secretary and receptionist for Marshall County R.E.C. until her retirement on January 1, 1971. Following the death of her husband in 1978, she was later married to Charles B. Pettingill on May 7, 1982 in Waukon, Iowa. Neoma was very active in the community during her life. She was a member of Grace United Methodist Church, fifty year member of the Order of Eastern Star Central Chapter #67, was appointed Grand Chaplain of the Order of Eastern Star of Iowa in 1965, member of the White Shrine, and volunteered as leader for Girl Scouts for 12 years, as well as the Red Cross and MMSC Hospital Auxiliary. She is survived by her daughter: Marlys (Mrs. Victor) Hoglan, of Coralville, two sons: Raymond (Harlietta) Helland of Marshalltown and David (Jeanette) Helland of Chesterfield, Missouri, seven grandchildren: Ted and Doug Hoglan, Brad, Brian, Trenton, Marshall and Lindsey Helland, and nine great-grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her parents. husband Earl T. Helland on October 28, 1978, husband Charles B. Pettingill on September 2, 1999, two sisters, two brothers, a step-son Charles E.
