Fred Honeck died at home here Tuesday
Funeral services at the St. Paul's Church Thursday afternoon
August 18, 1932 *State Center Enterprise*

Fred Honeck, aged 84 and a resident of this community for over forty years, died at his home in the northwest part of town at 8:45 Tuesday morning, death being due to general debility. Mr. Honeck had been failing since spring and had been bedfast since August 9th.

Fred Honeck was born Dec. 22, 1848, in Hanover, Germany and came to the United States with his parents at the age of eleven, settling near LaGrange, Illinois. In March, 1874, he was moved to Hampton, where he was married to Miss Tillie Everding. Three children born to this union survive. They are Mrs. Dena Doman and Fred Honeck Jr. of State Center and George Honeck of Albuquerque, New Mexico. Mrs. Honeck died on March 7, 1898.

The family moved to State Center in 1890, where they have since made their home. On July 20, 1918, Mr. Honeck was married a second time, to Mrs. Emma Schuler.

Besides the widow and children, Mr. Honeck is survived by a half brother, August, of Springfield, Mo., and two half sisters, Mrs. J.A. Cook, of Pharr, Texas, and Mrs. Louise Guiles, of Des Moines.

Funeral services will be held from St. Paul's Lutheran church of this city on Thursday afternoon, at 2:00 o'clock. Rev. A.H. Schultz, pastor of the church will be in charge of the services.
