

Isaac H. Hoy Passed Away Monday Afternoon

Death came on Monday afternoon to I. H. Hoy, for many years a resident of our community. Mr. Hoy had been ill for months and often during that time it seemed that death would come at any moment. After suffering much during his illness he passed away without a struggle.

Isaac Hugh Hoy was born in Story county on Christmas day, 1858, the son of Thomas and Phoebe J. Hoy. From the time he was five years old he lived in the Bethel neighborhood, in Jasper county, until after his marriage which took place in 1888. On July 18 of that year he was married to Harriet E. Plumb.

Mr. and Mrs. Hoy moved to Ardmore, S. Dak., and lived there for about 10 years. Then they returned to Iowa and in 1916 they came to this vicinity and have made this place their home ever since.

In 1938 Mr. and Mrs. Hoy celebrated their golden wedding anniversary and then, as always, Mr. Hoy was very happy in the company of his friends and relatives.

Surviving Mr. Hoy are his widow and eight children. These are Charles, of Colfax; Mrs. Phoebe Taylor, of Ira; William, James, Isaac, Elmer, Alva and Mrs. Vallie Rinard, all of this neighborhood. There are twenty-five grandchildren and one great-grandchild. There are two brothers, William and John, of Mingo, and two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Kintz, of Colfax, and Mrs. Rebecca J. Plumb, of Ardmore, S. Dak.

Funeral services were conducted at the Methodist church in Rhodes yesterday (Thursday) afternoon at 1 o'clock and in the Bethel church west of Baxter at 2:30, with the Rev. C. A. Krause and the Rev. Galen Gilbert officiating. Music was furnished by a mixed quartet, Mrs. Lester Breunig, Mrs. Wayne Hildreth, Luther Hix and Fred Cheville, with Miss Agnes Buck as pianist.

Arrangements for the funeral were in charge of the J. H.
