### Obituary.

The above obituary was read by the presiding minister, Rev. C. J. The church was filled with an audience that felt the sacredness of the solemn exercises. Many could not get admission, so large was the crowd. An efficient choir from the church at Peoria sang beautiful spiritual songs, with Mrs. Harry Gibson at the organ. The floral offerings were copious and very beautiful.

The interment was at Collins Cemetery. The pall bearers were P. D. Ozmun, Wm. Crabb, Flavius Pritchard, Orpheus Pritchard, Harland Carver and Harry Gibson.

The sadness of the early death of deceased, the husband so soon bereft, the motherless babe, the stricken and heartsore mother, the sorely bereaved brothers and sisters, the many friends whose hearts were deeply touched with grief, were poignant facts that gave touching emphasis to the services.
