## Forrest Earl Ives

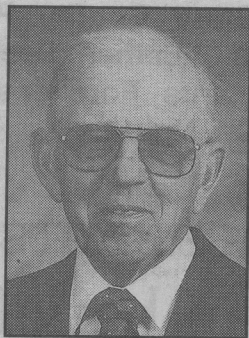
*June 24, 1919, to Nov. 1, 1999*

Forrest Earl "Frosty" Ives, 80, of Maxwell, died at his home from a heart attack Monday evening, Nov. 1.

He was born June 24, 1919, in Rolfe to Earl Albert and Ethel Valgene Crow Ives. He married Eunice Marie Glackin on April 24, 1948, in Algona. He graduated from Rolfe High School in 1936 and from Iowa State University in 1951, having majored in education. He served in the Navy during WWII in the African and European Theaters and was recently honored by the French Government on the 50th anniversary of the Normandy Invasion with a commemorative medal. He had taught farming in school in Rockwell City and Rolfe for eight years and farmed since 1953. He and his family moved to Maxwell in 1961, where he continued to farm and also worked at the National Animal Disease Laboratories in Ames as an animal caregiver. He retired in 1984 and continued his farming.

He was a member of the Maxwell First Presbyterian Church, the Maxwell Lions Club, the Maxwell VFW and the American Legion and the Maxwell Masonic Lodge. He supported many Maxwell area projects.

Survivors include his wife, Eunice, of Maxwell; two

sons, Kenneth Michael (and Patricia) Ives of Nokesville, Va., and Steven Earl (and Dorothy) Ives of Durand, Mich.; two daughters, Peggy Marie Ives (and Michael Holbert) of Johnston, and Carol Anne Ives Holmes (and Gary) of Belvidere, Ill.; 10 grandchildren; a brother, Rollin Ives of Parachute, Colo.; and a sister, Ruth Mary Jones of Ames. He is also survived by seven exchange students, Karl, Tobias, Matta, Mathias, Dirk, Jackie and Ruth. Eleven other exchange students stayed with the family for the summer months.

He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, Charles Morris Ives and Elwyn Ives.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. today (Thursday, Nov. 4) at the Maxwell Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Keith McDonald officiating. Burial will be near Maxwell. Military honors will be given by the Maxwell American Legion. A Masonic service was held Wednesday evening and a prayer service followed.
