Milo Jeffries, M.D., 94, of East Troy, Wisconsin, formerly of Marshalltown, died Tuesday, April 9, 2002, at the Kiwanis Manor Nursing Home, East Troy, Wisconsin. Milo was born October 29, 1907, in Leon, Iowa, the son of Willard and Mabel (Cummings) Jeffries . He attended Northwestern University in Chicago and Interned at Chicago's Wesley Memorial Hospital from 1936-1941. He then practiced general surgery in Chicago with his father. He was married to Wilma Easley, a Surgical Nurse, on October 31, 1937 in Chicago Illinois. he lived in Marshalltown from 1948-1991. He served his country in the Army from 1941-1945 as a Medical Unit Commander for the 33rd Infantry during the New Guinea and Luzon campaigns. He was awarded the Bronze Star for bravery under fire. After the war he specialized in OB-GYN in the Marshalltown Medical Clinic, where he delivered between 5,000-6,000 Marshalltown babies from 1948-1979 Milo was a member of the American Board of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, the American Medical Association, lifetime member of the Iowa Medical Society, and First Congregational Church of Marshalltown. He is survived by his son David Jeffries, of East Troy, Wisconsin, daughters Susan Weldon, of East Troy, Wisconsin and Kathleen Ann Jones, of Georgetown, Texas and five grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife in 1987, and his sister Annabelle Eeels.
