## Charles Kimberley, Collins, Dies

Charles W. Kimberley, 60, Collins, died Sunday at 2 a.m. in Lutheran Hospital, Des Moines, where he had been for three months.

Funeral will be Tuesday at 10 a.m. at the country home, five miles southeast of Collins, with the Rev. K. E. Nesbitt of Mingo in charge.

Burial will be in Peoria Cemetery south of Maxwell. He had lived in Collins area all of his life. He had been a farmer in that area and had worked at Exchange State Bank in Collins.

Surviving are his wife Grace (former Grace Hanson) of Collins; son George L., Collins; daughter Jean Lengeling, Collins; and nine grandchildren.

## C. W. KIMBERLEY LAID TO REST

Charles Wyatt Kimberley, son of the late Franklin and Nettie Bence Kimberley, was born at the family home in northeast Jasper county, December 29, 1895, and died at the Lutheran hospital, Des Moines, at the age of 60 years, 6 months and 17 days. He attended the local school and completed a business course at Capital City Commercial college, Des Moines.

Prior to entering the armed services in World War I he was employed in the Exchange State Bank at Collins. On his return to civilian life he entered the bank at Mingo as cashier, a position he held until moving to the home place in 1935. He retired from active business last fall.

On June 28, 1919, he was united in marriage to Grace Hanson. To this union three children were born: Mrs Cyril (Jean) Lengeling, Collins; George L. also of Collins, and Richard who died at the age of 11 in 1935.

He is survived by his wife, the daughter and son and nine grandchildren. Many other relatives and friends mourn his passing.

The funeral services were held from the home Tuesday morning, July 17, with the Rev. K. E. Nesbitt of Mingo in charge.

Interment was in Peoria cemetery.
