Mildred Jane Brinkman, 94, of Colo, died from respiratory failure Wednesday at the Ellsworth Municipal Hospital in Iowa Falls. Funeral services will be at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at the Colo United Methodist Church, with the Rev. Russ Burnett and Rev. Jim Louk officiating. Burial will be in the Nevada Municipal Cemetery.

Mildred Jane Brinkman was born on July 31, 1905, in Collins, the daughter of John B. and Minnie (Shearer) Kimberley. After graduating from high school, she attended Capital City Commercial College and then worked at the Collins and Mingo banks. She married Norman Henry (N. H.) Brinkman on June 4, 1927, in Collins. She was a homemaker and was very active in her church and community. She enjoyed music and taught piano

lessons for many years. She was a member of the Colo United Methodist Church, where she had served 35 years as church organist, UMW, Cloverleaf Club, Order of the Eastern Star, of which she was a past state officer, Priscilla Bridge Club, and a former member of the board of directors of the Exchange State Bank of Collins.

She is survived by two sons, John Brinkman of Mason City and Harold Brinkman of Nevada; one daughter, Mary J. Harms of Ames; eight grandchildren; one great-grandchild and two sisters, Minnie Maxwell of Washington and Kay Armstrong of Nevada.

She was preceded in death by her husband, one grandson, five brothers and one sister.
