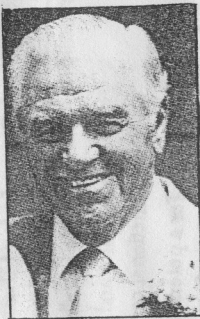


# Harold S. Kimberley

Harold S. Kimberley, 83, of Colo., died of complications of a stroke at Colonial Manor Care Center, Zearing.

He was preceded in death by four brothers; and one sister.

Funeral services were held Monday, Jan. 9, at Colo. United Methodist Church, Colo., with Rev. Robert King, Rev. Jack Weida, and Rev. Penny Hansel officiating. Burial was in Peoria Cemetery in Maxwell, with graveside military rites by Collins American Legion, Freeman-Carver, Post No. 81.
