The many local friends of Chas. E. Kime of New Hampton were saddened to learn of his death, which occurred Sunday at Mason City, immediate cause of death being a heart attack. He was 52 years old.

Funeral services were held at the Methodist church in New Hampton Wednesday afternoon, the military funeral being in charge of the American Legion. Interment was also at New Hampton. Those from Collins who attended the services were Dewey Kern, L. D. Holland, H. R. Sokol, H. C. Westcott and C. R. Stone.

We was well known over a wide section as a band leader, and had directed bands at various times at New Hampton, Collins, Fremont, Mingo, Alta Vista and other towns. Mr. and Mrs. Kime made their home in Collins for 10 years, during which time he directed the local band. He conducted a cafe here for some time and later a barber shop. They left Collins in 1930.

Mr. Kime was born at Rolfe, Ia., March 31, 1888. On Oct. 11, 1914, he was united in marriage at Des Moines to Miss Fay Lynch of Fremont, who with one son, Warren Edward, 12, survives him.

He is also survived by two sisters, Mrs. Alfred Robinson and Mrs. Wm. Kelley of Ottumwa; three brothers, George of Cedar Rapids, William of Tama and Perry of Marshalltown. A niece, Mrs. Pearl Beery of Ottumwa, and other relatives also survive to mourn his passing.
