

MRS. IDA VAN PELT DEAD.

Wel-Known Resident of State Center Succumbs.

Mrs. Ida Van Pelt, a well-known resident of State Center, died at her home at 8:30 o'clock Thursday night after a long illness. Mrs. Van Pelt had been in poor health for several years and had been confined to her bed five weeks.

Mrs. Van Pelt was born Ida Alice Kiser, in Bureau county, Illinois, April 24, 1860, a daughter of James and Sarah Kiser. The family come to Jasper county in the fall of 1864. In the spring of 1875 they moved to Marshall county, where the daughter was married to Aaron Van Pelt.

Mr. and Mrs. Van Pelt made their home on a farm near Rhodes

until the death of the former in January, 1901. Mrs. Van Pelt then moved to State Center with her son Floyd, then 8 years of age, and built a home. She was a member of the Christian church for years but later united with the Methodist church.

She is survived by her son, Floyd, his wife and four children, of State Center, and six sisters, Mrs. Nettie Winkler, St. Anthony, Idaho; Mrs. Hattie Emery, Ruthven; Mrs. Keith Vawter, Cedar Rapids; Mrs. Jay Nason, Vancleve; Mrs. Theo Pull, Marshalltown and Mrs. Laura Wallace, Manhattan, Ill.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Sunday from the Presbyterian church at State Center, in charge of Rev. Fred A. Smith, a former pastor at State Center, now of Shellrock. Burial will be in the Rhodes cemetery.
