

# Mrs. Wallace Loft Dies In City; Spent All Her Life In This Area

Mrs. Wallace E. Loft, 36, of 304 North Fifth avenue died unexpectedly late Sunday at Evangelical Deaconess hospital where she had been taken early Sunday morning. Death was of a cerebral hemorrhage. 24 MAY 1948

Marie Alice Robinson was born June 15, 1911 near Rhodes, the daughter of Elwood and Elva Kline Robinson. Her early life was spent near Rhodes and State Center.

In 1926 she was graduated from Rhodes high school, later being graduated from the Central Iowa Business college in 1930. On January 16, 1945 she was married to Wallace E. Loft in Marshalltown and they have since resided at 304 North Fifth avenue.

For several years Mrs. Loft was employed at the farm bureau office, the county treasurer's office and the auditor's office.

She was a member of the First Methodist church, an active worker in W.S.C.S., the choir and assistant organist for the church. She was also a member of the Legion auxiliary and past president of Beta Sigma Phi sorority.
